

# KI TISA

**GM** Here is a Gimatriya Match that points to Shabbat as equal to all of the Torah. Sh'mot 31:15 (from Ki Tisa)

שֵׁשֶׁת יָמִים יַעֲשֶׂה מְלָאכָה וּבַיּוֹם  
הַשְּׁבִיעִי שַׁבַּת שַׁבְּתוֹן קָדֵשׁ לַיהוָה  
כָּל־הָעֹשֶׂה מְלָאכָה בַּיּוֹם הַשַּׁבָּת  
מוֹת יוּמָת:

*Six days work may be done, but on the seventh day is a Shabbat of complete rest, holy to HaShem; whoever performs work on the Shabbat day shall be put to death.*

This pasuk is one of several in the Torah that sums up the mitzva of Shabbat.

And take a look at one of the p'sukim that it matched - D'varim 6:1 -

וְנָתַתְּ הַמִּצְוֹת הַזֹּאתִים וְהַמְשַׁפְּטִים  
אֲשֶׁר צִוָּה ה' אֱלֹהֶיכֶם לַלְמַד אֶתְכֶם  
לַעֲשׂוֹת בְּאֶרֶץ אֲשֶׁר אַתֶּם עֹבְרִים  
שָׁמָּה לְרִשְׁתָּהּ:

*This is The Commandment, the statutes, and the ordinances that HaShem, your God, commanded to teach you, to perform in the land into which you are about to pass, to possess it.*

The former pasuk is talking about Shabbat; the latter pasuk is talking about the whole body of Mitzva.

# PURIM

**GM** Was searching for GMs with various p'sukim in the Megila. Found this pasuk in Mishlei (11:10), which matched a pasuk in Esther that is basically an example of the fulfillment of the pasuk from Mishlei.

בְּטוֹב צְדִיקִים תִּעְלֶץ קְרִיָּה  
וּבְאִבְדַּר רְשָׁעִים רָגָה:

*When it goes well with the righteous, the city rejoices, and when the wicked perish, there is song.*

Esther 8:16 -

לְיִהוּדִים הָיְתָה אֹרֶה וְשִׂמְחָה  
וְשִׂשׂוֹן וְיָקָר:

*"The Jews had light and joy, and gladness and honor."*

A match at 2068, this pasuk from Megila is one of the ones that the KAHAL says out loud and the BK then reads. It is also said in the introductory p'sukim to havdala on Motza'ei Shabbat.

BTW, the KEIN TIHYEH LANU is a mini-prayer that we add to the pasuk in havdala, and we should pause before saying it so that it doesn't appear to be a continuation of the pasuk.
