GM The Seven Haftarot of Consolation from after Tish'a b'Av until the Shabbat before Rosh HaShana all come from the latter part of the book of Yishayahu, from ch. 40 and on. The haftara for Parshat Eikev is Yishayahu 49:14-51:3. The final pasuk of the haftara sums up the uplifting message of the Navi - 51:3 -

כִּי־נֹחַם ה' צִיּוֹן נֹחַם כָּל־הַחֲרָבוֹתֶיהָ
וַיֵּשֶׁם מִדְבָּרָהּ כְּעֵדֶן וְעֵרְבָתָהּ כְּגִן־ה'
שָׁשׂוֹן וְשִׁמְוֹנָה יִמְצָא בָּהּ תוֹדָה וְקוֹל
וְבִרָה:

For HaShem shall console Zion, He shall console all its ruins, and He shall make its desert like a paradise and its wasteland like the garden of HASHEM; joy and happiness shall be found therein, thanksgiving and a voice of song.

Among the many Gimatriya Matches I have found over the years of searching, a recurring type has been (what I call) BOOK-END GMs. Case in point - Sh'mot 6:1, the last pasuk of Parshat Sh'mot -

Parshat Sh'mot saw the People plunged into slavery and oppression. Things got even worse towards the end of the sedra. This pasuk starts us off on the road to Redemption. The pasuk from Yishayahu gives us a glimpse and a promise of the Geula Sh'leima.

The two p'sukim are GMs (4588).
