TZAV and Purim

✂ two Tzav Unexplaineds

The CHAMISHA MI YODEI'A is not the Seder night answer. For Parshat Tzav it is the five times it says (V')ZOT TORAT - HA-OLAH, HA-MINCHA, HA-CHATAT, HA-ASHAM, ZEVACH HA-SH'LAMIM.

The bicycle chain is for the Shalsholet, the rare TROP NOTE - found three times in B'reishit, and once in Parshat Tzav.

✂ and 5 pictograms for Purim for you to decipher with your family and guests ✂ the one with the equals sign is a five element pictogram that goes from left to right across the whole width of the ParshaPix

Pooh Bear + a basketball rim gives you PURIM.

The Xed out matza and wine happened on the Seder night during Esther's ordered 3 day fast.

Doll and then phone gives DALFON, one of Haman's sons.

Magilla Gorilla (for sale).

The big one: Hadassah Medical Center, equals, molecular diagram for an ester (An ester is an organic compound where the hydrogen in the compound's carboxyl group is replaced with a hydrocarbon group.), cricket bat, and a

dodo bird. Gives you: ...HADASSAH, HI ESTHER BAT DODO.

SH'MINI and PARA

Across the top you have sheep - relates to the korbanot at the beginning of the sedra and to the cud-chewing, split hooped animals that we may eat, from the end of the sedra. The haftara's final 2 p'sukim has the word TZON four times, in the description and prophecy of the Geula 🐏 the goat is also for the two parts of the sedra 🐏 and the Para Aduma for the maftir (and the Shabbat), but also for both sides of the sedra 🐏 then we come to the EISH ZARA, the strange fire of Nadav and Avihu 🐏 the prohibition of entering the Mikdash having recently drunk wine 🐏 here we go on permitted and forbidden foods: 🐏 the 1960 Plymouth Fury have a pair of fins - as did other cars of that era 🐏 below the car are scales, combining to the signs of a kosher fish 🐏 now go to the left of the ParshaPix below the fire and wine: 🐏 mammals: Chicago Bears helmet for the non-kosher ones 🐏 and the Los Angeles Rams for the kosher ones 🐏 Woody Woodpecker for the non-kosher birds 🐏 and a rubber duckie for the kosher ones 🐏 then there are two characters from Finding Nemo - Bruce, the shark, representing non-kosher fish 🐏 and Nemo himself, for the kosher fish 🐏 Jiminy Cricket for all the non-kosher insects 🐏 and a grasshopper representing the four kinds of locust/grasshoppers that are kosher - the question mark is for the uncertainty of most Jewish communities in knowing which are kosher and which are not 🐏 on the list of non-kosher birds

are the Nesher (as in the bottle of BIRA SH'CHORA 🐄 and the cup or KOS of it - that's why it's a double 🐄 and the PERES 🐄 the mouse is for the ACHBAR listed among the animals whose carcasses make a person TAMEI for a day 🐄 the big hook is for the big VAV of GACHON 🐄 which leaves us with nine representations of the name of the sedra. Take them as unexplained (except that you know the explanations already - SH'MINI. Your challenge is to say why for each one. Some are easy; some no so. The 8th one down is the most challenging - so consider yourself challenged 🐄 enjoy 🐄 Oops, I forgot the havdala candle, which is for our lif's challenge as Torah Jews, to distinguish between the sacred and the mundane, between the kosher and non-kosher, and between many other things to know what is proper and what is not 🐄 and one late entry for you to figure out
